The Caregiver Fair is a Livingston County event that focuses on caregiver issues and their challenges. We are anticipating attendance of over 350 area caregivers and decision makers for the purpose of gathering information to assist them in the care for others including infants through end of life.

We will have educational break out sessions and a chance for you to meet and greet potential clients.

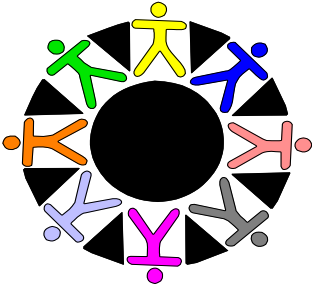

### **What is a “caregiver”?**

Anyone assisting another person with “Activities of Daily Living” (ADL) or “Instrumental Activities of Daily Living” (IADL)

**ADLs** are defined as self-care activities, things we normally do...such as feeding ourselves, bathing, dressing, grooming, work, homemaking and leisure.

**IADLs** are not necessary for fundamental functioning, but they allow an individual to live independently in a community. These include housework, meal preparation, taking medications, managing money, shopping for groceries or clothing, telephone use and using technology.

Caregivers are young and old, caring for children, parents, grandparents, siblings and friends. They need and seek information from medical professionals, media, friends and social service agencies.

### **This event will provide:**

- Information that will be appropriate for those caring for seniors and younger individuals needing guidance or professional assistance.
- Clinicians on-site to demonstrate and discuss hygiene care issues.
- Breakout sessions on hot topics

Livingston County's population is approximately 150,000. Accepting national and state demographic projections, there are an estimated 15,000 caregivers in the county. Forty seven percent of the county's “caregiver's” are dutiful family, friends or neighbors who do not see themselves in such a role and rarely seek help. Though they are well meaning, they are usually unaware of available support services such as transportation, nutritional care, financial counseling, home safety, respite and home care.
